Community and Media Statement: 10 July 2021

Sunday 11 July 2021 marks the first day of the holy month of Zul Hijjah, the 12th month of the Hijri calendar. This day heralds the imminent arrival of Eid-ul-Ad-Ha, the festival of sacrifice which will be on Tuesday 20 July 2021 in shaa Allah.
