Eidul Adha 2023 will fall on Wednesday, the 28th of June 2023

The first ten days of *Dhul Hijjah* are days of immense blessing. These are days where righteous deeds are even more beloved to Allah and more blessed. We should all take the opportunity to increase our acts of devotion to Allah, mend our lives and support others.

Lessons from the story of Prophet Ibrahim:

Dhul Hijjah is the month of the Hajj (pilgrimage to Makkah), where pilgrims perform numerous important rites. Whether we have the opportunity to perform the hajj this year or not, we can attune ourselves to the lessons from these rites:

- We experience the global sense of Muslim community
