AFIC extends its heartfelt solidarity to the Sikh community of Western Australia and across the nation. Dr. Jneid further remarked, "We urge everyone to remain calm and allow the authorities to conduct their investigations thoroughly. Speculation and premature conclusions serve only to exacerbate tensions. We trust in the Australian legal system to bring those responsible to justice swiftly."

AFIC calls on all leaders and communities to join in condemning this vile act and to work together to prevent such incidents in the future. We must all advocate for and implement measures that safeguard every community's right to worship peacefully and securely.

"In the face of such trials, our unity and collective voice against hatred and intolerance are more crucial than ever. We stand with the Sikh community, resolute in our belief that diversity and respect for all faiths are strengths that enrich our nation," concluded Dr. Jneid.
